

Human Trafficking

Human trafficking has more than doubled in the U.S. over the last 4 years to 1,091,000 trafficked individuals, the most of any country in the Americas. Thousands of women are sold for sex every day in NYC, in every neighborhood of every borough, and an estimated 26,000 people in NYC are being trafficked right now.

Human trafficking is a \$245 billion global industry and the second largest illegal activity, only to drug trafficking.

Despite the enormous scale of the problem of human trafficking, only 2% of philanthropic funding in the U.S. goes to women's causes, with much less specifically supporting anti-trafficking initiatives.

Alongside partners like you, Restore is working to end trafficking and to make freedom real for survivors. We empower each survivor to thrive in her community and ultimately experience sustained freedom—and we have the data to prove it.



Restore NYC is a nonprofit organization making freedom real for survivors of trafficking in the United States.

About Restore NYC

In 2024, Restore NYC was the sole organization in the nation to receive the Presidential Award for Extraordinary Efforts to Combat Trafficking in Persons.

Restore serves over 450 survivors and those at risk every year.

We trained over 1,400 people on human trafficking awareness in 2023, and our annual white papers influence government stakeholders and hundreds of organizations in the anti-trafficking field every year.

Restore's programs are driven on the strengths and resiliency of survivors. Yet, they face significant barriers in their journey to freedom.

We eliminate vulnerabilities that traffickers target, helping make freedom a permanent reality, through three core programs:

Clinical counseling, comprehensive empowerment case management, and resource coordination



Housing


Emergency housing, transitional housing, and independent living


